THE TRACY GILFORD SPIRIT AWARD

PPAM is very excited to announce a brand new award, The Tracy Gilford Spirit Award. It is awarded in recognition of service and giving spirit to Professional Photographers Association of Massachusetts and the photographic industry.

This Award will be presented to individuals for distinguished service to PPAM for 10 or more years. The Award shall be presented (one) annually to an individual who, by their ability, ingenuity, and selfless sharing of talents, has enriched PPAM and provided service of far-reaching value. The award is not necessarily conferred each year and may be awarded a total of 25 times.

Tracy Gilford has been a member of PPAM since 1985. This year we award Tracy himself this distinction and wish to thank him for his endless dedication for being the official photographer at the PPAM convention for more years than we can remember. His work in capturing the history of PPAM can go unnoticed to those that aren't involved in the inner workings of the association. His unobtrusive quite way of capturing every moment is a testament to his true professionalism and his dedication to PPAM.

Tracy has a heart of service...from boy scouts, to cleaning and picking up trash at the Korean War memorial because his dad served, he parked cars and was the official photographer for the pine speedway reunion, volunteered for the Groveland Historical Society as well as serving for 40 years on the Groveland fire department. He also has avidly supported and been deeply involved with raising money for Alzheimer's and Huntington's diseases.

These are some of the other organizations and activities that he has been involved in: Army Reservist, Volunteer Firefighter, Groveland Historical Society, American Legion, Community TV volunteer, Involved with his local church, 30 plus years as loyal and dedicated Mark Lawrence Photographers employee.

THE NATIONAL AWARD

This year's recipient of the PPA National Award is Paula Swift. Paula has volunteered with PPAM for years. She has served PPAM in many roles. From her earliest days as a member, she valued improving her work through the image competition process and wow'd judges, often taking home more than one award. She has shared her craft and expertise formally through teaching others, on more than one occasion, and has led multiple educational programs for PPAM and Photopaloozas.

Over the years, Paula has served PPAM in some of the more thankless roles - as Executive Council Secretary and on the PPAM Nominating Committee. She is a PPA approved juror and have served on the PPA Council. She has also served as Image Competition Co-Chair, and was instrumental in helping PPAM convert from "print competition" to "image competition" and helped pave the way for digital entries and digital judging.





She has also served as the VP of Technology and webmaster. And most recently she has volunteered for one of the most challenging and demanding roles, as President of PPAM.

Larry Lourcey said it best - Taylor Swift is the musical equivalent of Paula Swift. (Maybe awesomeness just goes with the name?) And like the other Swift, Paula has been an artistic storyteller for most of her life. She picked up her first camera around the age of 8 and was drawn to photograph people and children, and the cats they had when she was growing up. Her sister Gina was older and though she lived out of state by that point, Gina was Paula's closest mentor and teacher. She gave Paula her first film SLR (a Minolta SRT101).

In those early days, Paula only knew to keep the needle she could see in the viewfinder in the middle so the exposure would be correct. When Gina returned for another visit, she showed Paula how to develop film, and print Black & White, in a tiny closet in the basement of her Longmeadow home. Paula was hooked watching images magically appear under the red beam of light as she moved the developer back and forth over her first print. She pursued photography on the high school newspaper and went on first to a 2-year college to learn more about the fine art of photography coupled with art history and graphic design.

She then transferred to a 4-year college where she was accepted into the Communications Media - Photography degree program. (I believe that is where she also met her husband, Chris?)

Her sister Gina had moved to California and was a photojournalist there, and one summer she invited Paula out to visit and helped her build her portfolio. At that point, Paula says she knew she wanted to be a photojournalist - to tell people's stories through her eyes. She landed an amazing internship in her last year of college at the Worcester Telegram & Gazette, which led to freelance opportunities, then part-time work, and then a full-staff photographer. After 10 years, with a growing family, she knew she wanted to continue photography, but not for the paper. She began her portrait business, Paula Swift Photography, so she could continue telling people's stories through her amazing eye.

Paula has received many professional awards and accolades in her career. She has won too many photographic awards to list here. Her work has been published in numerous, internationally known publications. She has taught classes, and is a photographic competition judge herself. She has written the book - literally - on Storytelling Portrait Photography: How to Document the Lives of Children and Families.

As Paula & Chris' family grew to 3 sons (hockey players), along with a dog and a cat, and Paula and Chris both running her own businesses, you could rightly assume she was a busy person - and with a lot of heart. And in spite of all that busyness and because of that heart, Paula has served PPAM and shown herself to be beyond deserving of the PPA National Award.
